# *Pipes, Drums and Dancers of The Tacoma Scots*

The Tacoma Scots were formed unofficially in 1970! It actually started out as a Scottish Performing Arts Group to show off the students of the three teachers in piping, drumming and dancing. But, as the students grew more proficient, they wanted to stay together and, thus, The Tacoma Scots were born!

P/M Bill Micenko has been at the helm since the beginning. By 1975, the band became West Coast Champions in Grade II at Santa Rosa, California (the largest games on the West Coast).

The pipers, drummers and dancers now perform individually, as well as a unit, for any function from launching boats to tea parties. We regularly play for fraternal and Scottish groups. All funds received by our band are used to update our competition equipment. Our regular circuit for the summer is the Bellingham Highland Games,

Tacoma Highland Games, July 4th at Eatonville, the Portland Highland Games, P.N.W. Highland Games, Eatonville Arts Festival, and Host Band for Kelso's Scottish week-end. We also compete at Highland competitions from Canada to California. Our members travel from as far north as Bellingham and as far south as Portland to make our practices and shows.

For many years, the members of the Tacoma Scots Pipe Band wore their own family tartan kilts but, in 1988, the members elected to purchase new kilts of the Ancient Sinclair tartan to honor their Pipe Major and founder, William Micenko.

When you see us at a function, please come by and say "hello."



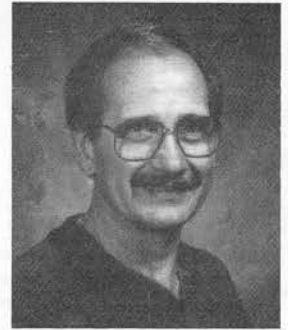

# The Scotsman of the Year

Back in 1974, the Olympia Highlanders wanted to honor their Pipe Major and teacher, John Lumsden, and, at the same time, create a way to recognize out-standing individuals who contributed time and effort to enhance our Scottish community. Thus, the Scotsman of the Year award was born. Over the years, the award was presented, at the Olympia Highlanders Tartan Ball, to a number of individuals and organizations.

In 1986, the Olympia Highlanders decided to break with tradition and began to include not only members of the South Puget Sound area but, individuals who had dedicated themselves, to the entire Pacific Northwest Scottish Community (which, of course, benefits the South Puget Sound area). The first person to receive the award outside the Olympia Highlanders was D/M Wally Clark in 1986. Subsequently, stalwarts of our local organizations such as P/M Jack Montgomery and P/M Bill Micenko were recognized. In 1989, the entire McBride/Reitalis Family (Bob, Barbara, John, Chris, Greg, Steven and Matthew McBride, and Ray and Sharon Reitalis) received the Scotsman of the Year award for their combined contributions to our Scottish community.

In 1988, the Olympia Highlanders curtailed their Tartan Ball. In the following years, the Scotsman of the Year award has been presented at the Clan Gordon Tartan Ball and at the Seattle Piping Society Indoor Highland
